We will receive **three offerings** as a part of our commitment to worship and service. I know you will come prepared to give generously as you have in the past. The designated offerings this year are:


The Cup of Water Fund is used by the Cabinet in support of Lay families who are facing financial hardship. To date, 19 grants have been issued ranging from \$250 to \$2000.

Global Aids The 2004 General Conference created the UMC Global AIDS Fund with the goal of raising \$8 million over the next four years. This fund provides United Methodists with a dedicated way to address the AIDS pandemic around the globe. Our share is \$1.00 per member.

Mission Central In 2006, Mission Central continued its significant ministry to people in need - 65,000 UMCOR Kits for world wide distribution, 5,000 Flood Buckets for areas in Northeaster US, medical/educational supplies, clothing, computers and daily use items sent around the world; 5 trailer loads to support Gulf Coast recovery efforts, and 28,000 Christmas and Easter "Candy Kits" that shared the good news of Jesus birth and resurrection through 98 Conference area ministries! As Mission Central celebrates its 5th year anniversary, it is expanding its outreach by establishing HUBs in our Districts – with Altoona, State College, and Williamsport Districts serving as the test sites for this exciting means of making it possible for more people to become the hands and feet of God in service!

Please continue to pray for our brothers and sisters across our conference that we might together experience God's power to make all things new and that we will truly be renewed by the Spirit of God during our time of Holy Conferencing in June.
